

Vermont Unemployment Rate Holds at 2.9 percent in January

The Vermont Department of Labor announced today that the seasonally-adjusted statewide unemployment rate for January was 2.9 percent. This reflects no change from the revised December rate. The national rate in January was 4.1 percent. As of the prior month's preliminary data, the Burlington-South Burlington Metropolitan NECTA was tied for the fifth lowest unemployment rate in the country for all metropolitan areas. Overall, Vermont's unemployment rate was tied for the fourth lowest in the country for the same time period.
