

Vermont Registered Apprenticeship Program

WHAT IS APPRENTICESHIP?

Apprenticeship is a training program that combines classroom training with on-the-job training. It requires an employer “sponsor” who is willing to provide the on-the-job training. In addition, an employer helps pay for part of the required instruction. Generally, apprentices complete over 140 hours of classroom training per year. Depending upon the occupation, apprenticeship lasts for 1-6 years.

Vermont has apprenticeships in over 30 occupations. The following is a partial list of the occupations in which there are apprentices:



Plumber
Electrician
Child Care Development Specialist
Line Maintainer (Utilities)
Machinist
Carpenter
Sheet-Metal Worker
Tramway Maintenance Technician (Ski Lift)



HOW DO I BECOME AN APPRENTICE?

In order to be an apprentice, you must first have an employer who is willing to sponsor you. You can find employers who may be interested in a variety of ways, including using the Vermont Department of Labor Resource Centers located at the following sites:

You can also apply directly to employers who employ the types of workers in the occupation in which you are interested. For example, if you would like to be a plumbing apprentice, you could apply for work with any of the local plumbing contractors. If you were interested in becoming a child care development specialist, you could check with any of the local day care centers.
