Subject: Unemployment Insurance Weekly Update

Executive Summary:

During the benefit week ending April 3, there were 28,725 weekly claims filed. This is a decrease of 2,836 over the previous benefit week. While this the decrease in claims filed is greater than what the data shows for previous weeks, the number of claimants filing for benefits is still significantly higher than pre-pandemic conditions. During the week ending April 3, \$12,551,405 in benefits were paid out to claimants.

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Claimants continue to exhaust their benefit year on a weekly basis and must open a new benefit year to continue to receive benefits. As claimants are identified by the system as exhausting their benefits, they will receive an email from the Department outlining the steps to take to open a new benefit year. The link in the section below also contains the same information and steps included in the email.

The Department continues to receive communication from employers about struggles to find workers. The Workforce Development Division continues to help support employers and job seekers through various programs and services. Currently, the work search requirement has been waived, but will likely be reinstated in the coming weeks. Claimants are encouraged to continue to look for work and accept suitable work if they are able. If the Department receives a report that an individual turns down suitable work and does not have a qualifying reason to do so, it may result in the claimant becoming ineligible for benefits for committing fraud by failing to disclose information in an effort to continue to receive benefits.








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CALL VOLUME







