Subject: Unemployment Insurance Weekly Update

#### **Executive Summary:**

During the benefit week ending April 10, there were 30,528 weekly claims filed. This is an increase of 1,803 over the previous benefit week. During the week ending April 10, \$10,911,937 in benefits were paid out to claimants. Additionally, the Department released the unemployment rate for March 2021 last week. The seasonally adjusted statewide unemployment rate for March was 2.9%, a decrease of 0.1% from the prior month.

Recently, the Department has seen the number of suspicious initial unemployment insurance claims being filed increase exponentially. The Department has implemented various processes to detect potentially fraudulent claims to stop the claim before the fraudster attempts to file weekly claims and receive benefits. However, Vermonters, both those filing for unemployment and those who are employed, are encouraged to closely monitor accounts, email, and mail for any suspicious activity. If claimants receive any correspondence from the Department that seems suspicious or fraudulent in nature, they should contact the Department immediately to report it as fraud by submitting a fraud report (link below) or by calling the UI fraud tip line at 802-828-4104.

Claimants who have not yet enrolled in the IDX identity protection may still do so. In total, there were 98,719 individuals eligible to enroll in the IDX Identity Protection service being offered by the Department to those included in the 1099 incident. As of April 19, there were 12,878 individuals who had enrolled in the protection.








