**Subject:** Unemployment Insurance Weekly Update

During the benefit week ending May 22<sup>nd</sup> there were 23,718 weekly claims filed. This is a decrease of 4,688 continued claims filed over the previous benefit week. During the week ending May 22, \$9,157,894 in benefits were paid out to claimants.

Department of Labor offices were closed on Monday, May 31, in observance of the Memorial Day holiday. As a result, processing did not occur, protocol that is consistent with State of Vermont observed holidays. Claimants will see a slight delay (likely one or two days) in receiving their weekly benefit payment.

In the coming weeks, Department of Labor Career Resource Centers, located across Vermont, will begin to reopen for in-person services by appointment only. The Workforce Development division shifted to a virtual posture last spring and will now begin the transition to serving Vermonters in regional offices.

Offices will not return to pre-pandemic operations yet and will be only offering by appointment services in person. Vermonters interesting in working with Workforce Development are encouraged to set up an appointment by contacting their local office (phone numbers below). Virtual services will remain an option.

It is important to remember, regional office staff are members of the Workforce Development division, focused on helping job seekers reengage with the workforce and find meaningful employment. With that in mind, they are not trained members of the Unemployment Insurance division, do not have access to the UI system, and are extremely limited in their ability to troubleshoot claimant issues because it is not their area of expertise. To that end, regional offices should not be viewed as a resource for claimants to have their UI issue resolved. Claimants with an existing issue are encouraged to contact the UI Claimant Assistance Center at 877-214-3332 for assistance with their claim.












